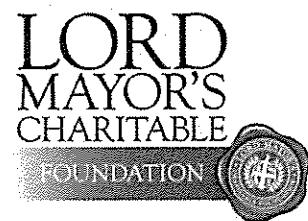

While appeals such as this have a specific aim, many Foundation events and appeals have become firmly entrenched in Melbourne's calendar, attracting great support from sponsors and donors. These include a most enjoyable and moving 'Christmas in July,' the 'Melbourne's Road Home Forum' Winter Days of Giving' with 3AW and the annual 'Heart of Melbourne' dinner.

This year we distributed \$7.7 million to more than 450 charities assisting those who are homeless, disabled or marginalised in other ways. Throughout the year, the generosity of donors, charitable trust account holders and corporate partners made a significant difference to Melbourne's most disadvantaged people. The Foundation worked with a record number of donors and 27 new charitable trust accounts were established. Once again we recognise and thank the Eldon and Anne Foote Trust, a major contributor to the Foundation.

The Lady Mayoress' Committee also continued to make a substantial contribution to fundraising in this city. The Committee celebrated its 50th anniversary last year and looks ahead to exciting new opportunities and enjoyable events in 2012.

The Club aims to develop and create goodwill, fellowship and a spirit of unity amongst its members in the Air Cargo industry

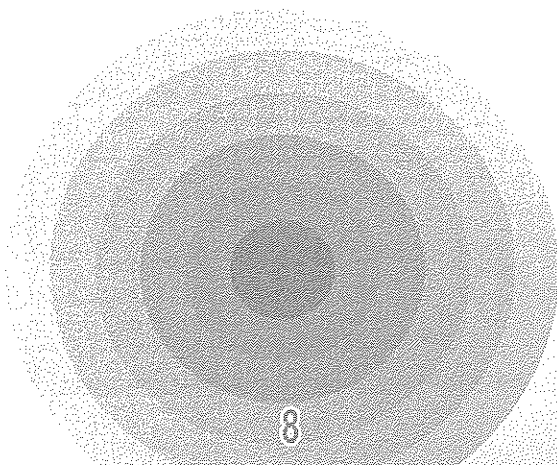

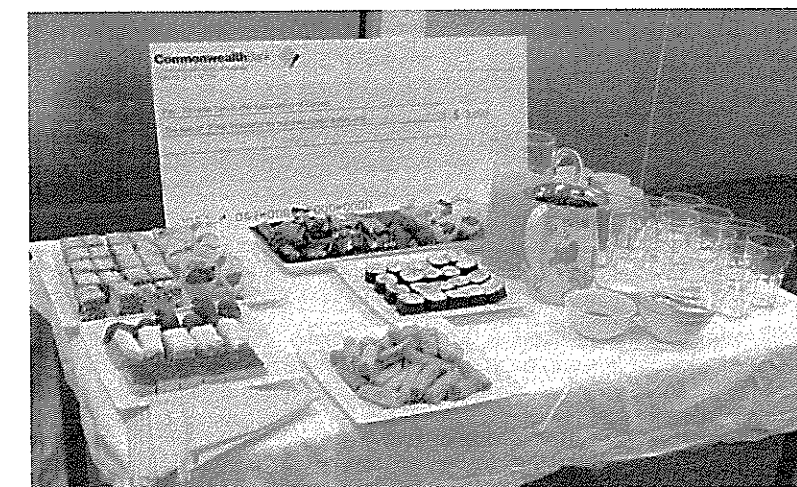
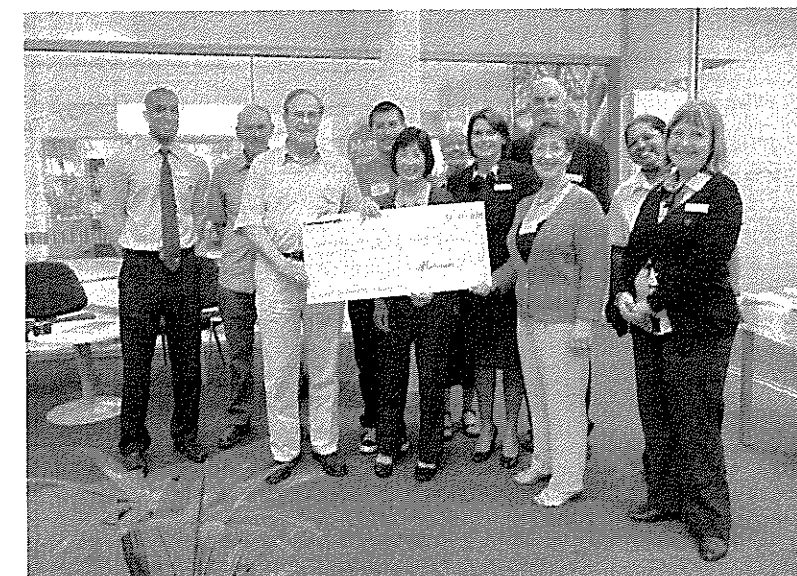


The Application for Funds Grant closed on the 18th November 2011.

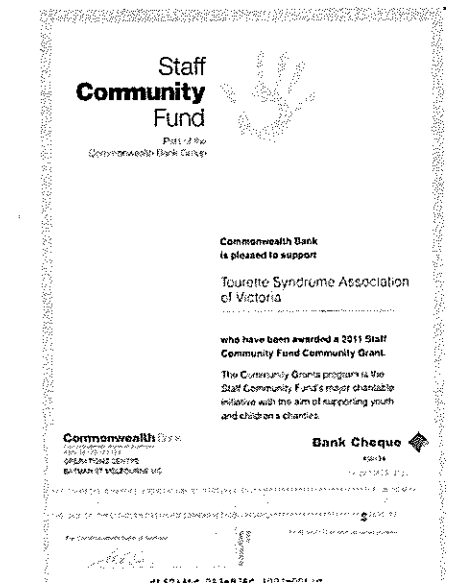
Commonwealth Bank Staff Community Fund Grant
